

Leonard Bernstein was one of the greatest musicians of the 20th century: as composer, conductor, pianist, writer and communicator. He was the heir of Gershwin in successfully bridging popular and serious idioms in music, and from the time of his debuts in the 1940s as composer and conductor, he remained at the forefront of international musical life. Since his death in 1990, his compositions have rightly maintained his artistic significance. We will explore aspects of his rich legacy, with illustrations on excellent hi-fi equipment including DVD with large screen..

Gwyn Parry-Jones graduated from the Royal Northern College of Music, and played for some years with the Halle and BBC Philharmonic Orchestras. He then lectured at Reading University, leaving recently to concentrate on his musical interests, principally conducting, performing and lecturing.
